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
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

the designated heritage property. While portions of the original home would be retained, most of the trees on the beautiful site would have to be cut down and the existing wetland, forming a tribu-

tary of the Loyalist Creek, filled and realigned. Councilor Katie Mahoney, City of Mississauga planning staff and your association are opposing this development on the basis that it is contrary to recognized development policies and the City's official plan. Along with the undesirable increased density, there will be a significant negative impact upon our neighbourhood if the mature trees and the original heritage features of the Hammond

It was a packed house at the **Sherwood Forrest Residents** Association AGM held at Carmel Heights Seniors Residence on Oct. 15. Among the evening's presentations:

- * Outgoing President Teresa Pamatat thanked everyone for the support given to her while she was president and asked those in attendance to take on an active role in SFRA;
- *** SFRA city liaison Steve Blaney** reported on Mississauga's Stormwater Financing Study. He noted that the municipality has \$1.75-billion invested in aging stormwater management infrastructure and is spending more than \$15-million a year on its

maintenance and improvement. Options to fund this growing expense include increased property taxes and user fees, Blaney added, suggesting that models based upon runoff contribution might be more acceptable than market value in the case of **Sherwood Forrest.**

- *** Councillor Katie Mahoney con**firmed the information that Steve had presented and answered questions posed by attendees. She promised to look into the functioning of the traffic lights at King Forrest Drive and Dundas Street;
- *** Constable Philip Stiff assured us** that the crime rate in the Sherwood area is quite low in comparison to

other areas. He reminded us that our diligence in the neighbourhood outweighs that of an officer driving through. Our knowledge of the area and persons who should (or should not) be there are valuable advantages. Officers in the area do not have these advantages and are limited to a front view of your residences (therefore are not able to see rear doors, windows, etc.).

Constable Stiff also provided us with a link to the Crime Mapping system (behind 24-48 hours after the original report).
